The Master's of Science offered in the School of Nursing has been existence for almost 20 years. A proposal to change the name of the degree is presently seeking approval. A second component of these changes is to recognize the faculty expertise for the next CPR cycle and whether the fields offered in the graduate programs are congruent.

During the CPR self-study process completed in December 2012 it was recognized that with the almost complete turnover in faculty in the last ten years and development in the field of nursing research since 2000 the fields in the Master's programs have become outdated and misaligned with a) faculty experience and expertise, b) the PhD program, and c) future plans for expansion in the School of Nursing.

The suggested fields were considered by the reviewers during the site visit and reflected the development of the discipline in nursing since the Master's program was initiated in 1994.

The new fields align with the GDLEs, there are no structural changes to the program, there are no new core courses to be created. Students and faculty were part of the self-study for the CPR process

conducted in the School of Nursing during 2012 and no issues raised by the review team.

The information has been presented in the School of Nursing Self-Study CPR documents. The CPR process is complete at the Faculty level and all documents, reports and responses are under review by the Senate CPR Committee.

The new fields are: 1) Chronic Health Conditions, 2) Primary Health Care Nursing, and 3) Transitions in Health and Illness. The three fields are broadly defined to capture both wellness and illness at the individual and population level.

As stated earlier, the new fields recognize the health challenges to Canadians in the 21<sup>st</sup> century and reflect the expertise of faculty. Several faculty have research programs that cross at least two fields. By being able to advertise these new fields we hope to attract well qualified bright nurses who wish to complete graduate education at Queen's. In addition, during the self-study process we examined the websites of all Nursing Programs in Ontario to understand their nursing fields. Our fields are similar but not the same as other nursing programs.
